

Bullick collection moved into new building, Heritage Center seeking volunteers

Earlier this summer, most of the physical work on the building that will house the McCandless/Northern Allegheny Heritage Center was completed.

With that work done, members of the Town's Public Works crew spent several days in June moving items from local historian Joe Bullick's collection from its old home — McKnight Elementary School — to its new home adjacent to Town Hall.

The collection contains hundreds of household items, farm equipment, military and sports uniforms, photographs, maps, high school yearbooks and lots of other regional items and documents primarily from the first half of the 20th century.

"There are things in the museum that are almost a hundred years old," Bullick said.

The largest item in the collection is a 500-pound wood-burning stove that came from a farmhouse. Bullick said this stove likely dates from the 1930s.

"That was a common stove at that time," he said. "This is my pride and joy, this stove."

The collection also has a jukebox dating to 1954, several old radios and wind-up record players, lots of early area maps, an apple cider press, and dozens and dozens of other items sure to incite nostalgia.

took place in September 2014. Students from A.W. Beattie Tech, members of the Town's Public Works crew and several local contractors worked hard to make the building a reality.

Now that the building is done and the move is complete, **volunteers are needed** to help clean and catalog the collection.

A sneak preview for the Heritage Center is planned to take place at Community Day on Saturday, September 10.

The Heritage Center building is a replica one-room school-house located on Pump House Lane off Grubbs Road. The building was designed by Ralph Sterzinger of RSSC Architecture. A groundbreaking



Waste Management taking over trash and recycling on Oct. 3

Starting Monday, October 3, Waste Management will be handling the Town's trash, recycling and yard waste pickup.

Town Council on April 25 voted to award the contract to Waste Management. The five-year contract will expire Dec. 31, 2021.

During the first year of the contract, customers with a 35-gallon trash cart will pay \$63 during each four-month billing cycle. Customers with a 65-gallon cart will pay \$71.72 each

billing cycle. Customers with a 95-gallon cart will pay \$80.44 each billing cycle.

The senior rate — which offers a 10-percent discount to senior citizens and people who are permanently disabled — during the first year of the contract will be \$57.04 each billing cycle for those with a 35-gallon cart. The senior rate with a 65-gallon cart is \$64.88 during each billing cycle, and the senior rate with a 95-gallon cart will be \$72.76 each billing cycle.

In September, Town residents will receive a new Customer Handbook with updated information on the trash and recycling program, as well as new information related to Waste Management.

Waste Management was the lowest qualified bidder. It was one of three bidding companies, along with Vogel Disposal and Republic Services — which is the Town's current hauler. Republic will continue to handle the Town's trash and recycling through September 30.

SOME CHANGES, BUT MOST THINGS WILL STAY THE SAME

With the new contract, most things residents are used to will not change.

Basic trash, recycling and yard waste procedures will stay the same. Residents still will have a 35, 65 or 95-gallon **black top** cart for trash and 35, 65 or 95-gallon **blue top** cart for recycling. Residents also will continue to have the option of a 95-gallon **green top** cart for yard waste.

Unless you receive a letter from Waste Management, your trash day will stay the same, as well.

One thing that will change is the bulk item pickup day. Certain small bulk items — such as lamps, vacuum cleaners and up to three 32-gallon trash bags at a time — will continue to be picked up on your regular trash day. With reduced demand, other bulk items — including appliances, furniture, oversized items and volume pickups — will be picked up on **Wednesdays only**.

At Your Door HHW and E-Waste Collection

As a part of the contract with Waste Management, residents will have a convenient new opportunity to dispose of **Household Hazardous Waste** — such as cleaners, chemicals and automotive products — and **E-Waste** — such as old computers, televisions and other electronics.

The At Your Door HHW and E-Waste Collection program allows residents to easily dispose of these often difficult-to-recycle items.

First, you have to schedule your collection. There are three ways to do this:

The call center operators will guide you through the steps toward a safe and successful collection. You will be asked several questions, including your address and the type and amount of materials available for the pick up. You will be provided a convenient collection date and information about where to place the kit for collection. A kit will be sent to your home in plenty of time for you to gather and pack your materials.

Preparing for collection

The collection kit includes an instruction sheet and other items to help pack and secure your household generated special materials. Please read the instruction sheet included in the kit.

On the day of collection

On the scheduled date, the customer service technician will collect materials directly from your home. They will sort and pack the materials for proper transportation, recycling and disposal. Participants will receive a postage-paid survey card to complete and mail back to help track the program.

Got more stuff than will fit in the kit? Don't worry.

Remember, this service will be available year-round, and **the cost is included in your regular trash bill**. Just schedule another collection! Small quantities may be combined with your neighbors. Goodwill e-waste collection a success

The Town of McCandless, Ohio Township and Goodwill again teamed up this year for a major e-waste collection, which was held Saturday, June 18.

Roughly 500 cars cycled through the Town Hall parking lot between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Vehicles began lining up shortly after 9 a.m.

The collected items filled 74 bulk boxes — which in turn filled one full semi-truck trailer and one smaller truck trailer. Permitted items included computers, printers, cell phones, digital cameras, microwaves and cables.

Thank you to the crew from Goodwill, employees from McCandless and Ohio, and to all the residents who participated in the collection.



The Town is on Facebook now!

Town Council creates Environmental Advisory Committee

Council on Monday, May 23 voted unanimously to establish an **Environmental Advisory Committee**.

The Committee is designed to advise Town Council on a variety of matters concerning the environment in the Town. The committee will help develop and recommend policies and programs to Town Council to preserve and enhance aspects of the Town's character, and will address environmental issues in the Town.

The Committee will consist of seven members who are Town residents appointed by Town Council serving a staggered four-year term, plus one Council member who serves as liaison to Council.

Once it is formed, the Committee will meet on the second Wednesday of each month.

Appointment policy approved



Town Council on May 23 unanimously adopted a new appointment policy for authorities, boards, commissions and advisory committees.

Under the policy, an application form for positions on these entities will be made available on the Town's website and at Town Hall. These applications will be accepted at any time for any positions, and they will be kept on file at Town Hall for two years.


If a vacancy occurs, the position will be advertised on the Town website for 30 days, unless a different length of time is set by Town Council. If feasible, the position will be advertised in other Town publications.

Applicants will be interviewed by Town Council, and a majority vote by Council will result in appointments being made.

Reappointments will be considered by Town Council after consulting with the entity's Council Liaison or Committee Chair. Additionally, people appointed to these entities after June 1, 2016, may not hold more than two appointed positions at a time.

Town Finances 101



Attempting to peruse and understand the Town's 2015 Audited Financial Statement (74 pages, including attachments) or 2016 Budget Document (117 pages, including the Budget Message) can be a daunting task for those who don't work with numbers on a daily basis. Frankly, it can be daunting at times for those of us who do this for a living.

When you look at the big picture, these numbers can be more readily understood by answering the following series of questions:

1. What services are provided by the Town, and how much do they cost?
2. Where does the money come from to pay for these services?
3. How much do I pay in taxes, and where does that money go?


4. Does the Town have to borrow money to pay for the services provided?
5. How does the pension crisis that has been reported in the news affect the Town?
6. How much money does the Town have in savings, and why is it there?
7. What are the Town's financial plans for the future?

8. How does McCandless compare to other communities in Allegheny County?

We will answer each of these questions in upcoming issues of the Town Crier and McMail, and you can help. You can email us at administration@townofmccandless.org and let us know if you have any additional questions or comments. We can then work your responses into our upcoming articles.

Lets talk about taxes in McCandless



The Town's property tax millage rate is 1.296 mills (\$129.60 per \$100,000 of assessed value) for the 2016 calendar year. The North Allegheny School District (NASD) millage rate is 18.0011 mills for the 2016-17 fiscal year (which runs from July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017).

The tax due dates are September 1 to pay at the 2% discount, and November 1 to avoid the 10% penalty. These dates were outlined in the 2016 Town Calendar, which was mailed to you last December, and are also posted on the Town web site.

Please note that failure to pay your tax by December 31 may result in a lien being placed against your property. By law, all NASD real estate taxes that remain unpaid as of December 31 must be turned over to the delinquent tax collector for the school district (Maiello, Brungo & Maiello, LLP).

Town of McCandless delinquent real estate taxes are still due and payable directly to the Town.

The tax bills (Town and school district on one bill) were mailed on July 1. When reviewing your bill, please note the following:

- If you have been approved by Allegheny County for an Act 77 Senior Citizen Abatement, the 30 percent reduction in your Town assessed value has already been factored into the tax amount that appears on your bill.
- If you were approved by Allegheny County prior to April 30, 2016 for a Homestead Exclusion under Act 1 of 2006, also known as the Taxpayer Relief Act, then the reduction in your NASD assessed value appears as a separate line item on your bill.
- If you qualified for a Homestead Exclusion prior to April 30, 2016, you are also eligible to take advantage of the installment payment plan offered by both the Town and the school district. To elect the installment payment plan option, you must pay the first installment amount stated on the bill (no other amounts accepted) by September 1. Payments received after September 1 will be considered timely only if they contain an official U.S. Postal Service postmark of September 1 or earlier. If any installment payment is late, you will be disqualified from the installment program for 2017, and you will be subject to payment of your entire tax bill in full subject to the standard deadlines and terms.
- If you choose the installment payment plan option and make your first payment in a timely manner, you will then receive two additional installment bills with due dates for those two payments. Payments received after either of these due dates, subject again to the official postmark, will be charged a penalty of 10 percent. If your payment is more than 10 days late for either of these installments, or if your payments for both of these installments are late for any period of time, you will not be eligible for the installment plan the following year.
- If you have not received a tax bill, please contact our office immediately at 412-364-0616 and we will send you a new bill. In addition, if the billing address for your real estate tax bill changed after January 1 of this year, you need to notify us immediately. Allegheny County provides us with a billing address as of January 1, but they do not provide us with updates if there is a change after this date. Your billing address may change because you paid off your mortgage and no longer have your taxes escrowed, your mortgage was sold and you have a new escrow agent, or you are the owner but not the occupant of a property and you move to a new address.

Local Services Tax

Any individual who works in the Town and has earned income and/or net profits of over \$12,000 within the Town is required to pay this tax. The tax rate is \$52 per year, but employees are only liable for the tax for pay periods in which they are employed. Employers are required to withhold the tax on a pro-rata basis based on the number of pay periods in a calendar year (26 if you are paid every two weeks, 24 if you are paid twice a month, etc.). Self-employed individuals are required to pay the full \$52 in quarterly installments. The Town appointed Keystone Collections Group, effective January 1, 2011, to collect the local services tax. Keystone is located at 546 Wendel Road, Irwin, PA 15642. They can be contacted at 724-978-0300 or online at www.keystonecollects.com.

Business Privilege Tax

If you operate a business located in the Town, either out of your home or at a specific commercial location, you are required to file and pay this tax. The tax deadline was May 16, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. Please check the 2016 Town Calendar, view the Town website at www.townofmccandless.org, or call us at 412-364-0616 for more information. In addition, you can print a copy of the Town's Rules and Regulations directly from the website.

Drop Box Procedures

Due to concerns regarding the safety of both tax payers and Town staff, payments placed in the drop box or any other location on the Town premises after 7:00 pm on the due date will be considered late, and will be subject to the appropriate penalties and interest. The Town tax office will remain open until 7:00 pm on September 1 and November 1 to accept timely Real Estate Tax payments. Payments postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service by the above due dates will continue to be considered timely.

Earned Income and Net Profits Tax

The Town contracted with Keystone Collections Group of Irwin, PA for the collection of this tax for 2011 and future tax years. They are located at 546 Wendel Road, Irwin, PA 15642, and can be reached by phone at 724-978-0300.

You can also get tax forms and other information by visiting www.keystonecollects.com. Please remember that you must make quarterly estimated tax payments if you are self-employed. The only exception is that anyone earning \$12,000 or less is not required to make quarterly payments.

Per Capita Tax

All residents of the Town over the age of 21 are required to pay this North Allegheny School District tax. The 2016 Per Capita Tax bill is based on the NASD fiscal year of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. The billing procedure in 2016 is the same as that used since 2006. Unless you have contacted us previously, each residential property will have \$20 added to the real estate tax bill to account for two individuals in the household over the age of 21. Additional residents in each household and renters over the age of 21 will be sent a separate bill. If you have only one resident in your household over the age of 21, please contact us immediately so that the adjustment can be made. If you have more than two residents and do not receive an additional bill, please contact us so that we can add those individuals. If you receive a bill but are not yet 21, please write your month and year of birth on the bill, sign and date it, and return it to us. Owners of rental properties are required to notify the Town of the move in and move out dates of all tenants.

Helpful fire safety tips from your friendly neighborhood Fire Marshal



Summer is a great time to do things like take a road trip, but it's important not to leave fire safety at home!

Keep these tips in mind to find a **fire-safe hotel** for your trip.



When staying at a motel or hotel, choose one that has a fire sprinkler system and smoke alarm system. Ask the front desk clerk about the fire notification system and what the fire alarm sounds like. Review the fire escape plan posted in the room.

Once you arrive at the hotel, here are some things to look for:

- Check the floor where your room is located. Can you see a minimum of two exits?
- Are the exit signs illuminated so that they can be easily read?
- Is there a fire extinguisher on the floor?
- You will also want to check to see if there is a fire alarm on the floor.
- Doors leading to the outside should be able to be easily opened.
- Once you get to your room, check to see if it is equipped with a smoke detector.
- A fire evacuation plan should be posted in your room. You will probably find it attached to the inside of the door. If you don't see one when you enter the room, contact the front desk to ask for one.
- Identify the exits – count how many doors are from your room to the nearest exit – in case you are not able to see either from smoke or power outage.
- Whether you're in a hotel or a restaurant or a museum, always make sure you are familiar with where the closest exits are located. This will be very important if a fire or other emergency breaks out.





Grilling Fire Safety

Knowing a few fire safety grilling tips will help everyone have a safe summer.



Only use your grill outside.

Keep it away from siding and deck rails.



Keep a 3-foot safe zone around your grill and campfire.

This will keep kids and pets safe.

Clean your grill after each use. This will remove grease that can start a fire.



Place the coals from your grill in a metal can with a lid once they have cooled.



Open your gas grill before lighting.

Keep an eye on your grill, fire pit or patio torches.



Never leave any of them unattended.

What to do with your grass clippings ...

Whatever you do, don't dump them on creek and stream banks

Over the years, residents who abut streams have used grass clippings and leaves as mulch on stream banks or used the streams as a conduit to dispose of grass clippings and leaves.

In addition to being a violation of state law, both of these practices are harmful to the health of streams.

Rather than viewing grass clippings and leaves as waste, they can be a commodity. The Town participates in a composting program that turns your leaves into useful compost.

If you want to make your own compost using your grass clippings, the Town website has a recipe for creating good compost. Go to [www.townofmc-](http://www.townofmc-candless.org)

[candless.org](http://www.townofmc-candless.org) and click on "Trash Recycling and Yard Waste" under the Popular Pages section. From there, click on "Composting." Do not compost in a designated flood plain.

If you choose to dispose of grass clippings, yard waste containers are provided by the Town's trash hauler. Through September 30, the trash hauler is Republic Services, who can be contacted at 1-800-464-2120. Starting October 3, Waste Management will be the new trash hauler. They can be contacted at 1-800-866-4460.

If you do not have a yard waste container, you can buy compostable bags at your local home improvement or hardware store.
