Customer Assistance Program (CAP)

This program is set up between the utility company and a low-income, payment troubled consumer to pay utility bills that are based on household size and gross household income. CAP customers agree to make regular monthly payments, which are usually less than the current bill, in exchange for continued utility service. Besides regular monthly payments, customers need to follow certain rules to remain eligible for continued participation. CAP customers can choose a competitive electric supplier, but the discount they receive from CAP may be greater than the discounted rate offered by the supplier.

Customer Assistance Referral and Evaluation Program (CARES)

The Customer Assistance Referral and Evaluation Program (CARES) was designed to help customers with special needs find ways to pay their utility bills. Special needs include family emergencies, divorce, unemployment, or medical emergencies.
