## INSPECTOR'S REPORT

The estimated construction value for building in the Township for 1967 was, less land costs, \$10,055,571.00. 308 building permits were issued last year, 200 of which were for new homes (which includes four two-family dwellings). The cost of these residences amounted to \$4,950,900, making the average cost of a home \$24,750 as compared to \$22,745 in 1966.

Other building was as follows: Thomas E. Carson Junior High School, off Hillvue Lane, \$3,700,000; Wexford Plaza Shopping Center, \$225,000; Shop 'N Save Market, Ingomar, \$200,000; dormitory and lobby addition to Sisters of Divine Providence, Babcock Boulevard, \$190,000; Childress Animal Hospital, Wexford, \$75,000; five mausoleums, Allegheny County Memorial Park, \$60,000; Ingomar North Swimming Club shelter house, \$30,000. Alterations permits amounted to \$387,086.00 which included a \$175,000 addition to the Vincentian Home at Perrymont and McKnight Road. Permits for private garages and carports, swimming pools, accessory buildings, etc., amounted to \$217,585.00.

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



# POLICE DEPARTMENT

## Chief Harry Wylie

On April 1, 1967, we appointed five additional police officers to the patrol system but on May 20, 1967, for the third consecutive year, we suffered the loss of a police officer, this time through the untimely death of Lt. John M. Geisler, with a heart attack. We held examinations for Lieutenants and as a result of that examination, Officer Patrick B. McCabe and Officer Charles P. Toth were appointed to the rank of Lieutenant on September 1, 1967.

On September 27, 1967, Officer Joseph Szarmack sustained a severe back injury in the line of duty. On October 1, 1967, we returned one of the new officers back to the Civil Service Board as unsatisfactory. On November 1st of last year we appointed Officer Ralph J. Ledonne to full time Youth Aid Officer, which reduces our force to nine patrolmen. The Department now consists of one Chief, three Lieutenants, one Youth Aid Officer, nine patrolmen, two full time civilian radio operators, one police secretary, twelve uniformed auxiliary police and nine school guards. Our new Cadet system supplies us with Wm. Blakely, III, Gary Anderson, and Timothy Waibel as radio operators.

The dog catcher spends three days a week or a minimum of four hours a day patrolling the Township. He is also on duty on emergency calls and at various times during the week to pick up dogs placed in the coop at the Township building, and to be assisted by our police officers in rounding up excessive stray animals.

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

## McCANDLESS TOWNSHIP AND THE BOCA ORGANIZATION

The Building Officials Conference of America, Inc., is a non-profit organization of local government officials who formulate or administer laws, ordinances or regulations relating to buildings, housing, planning and zoning. Its purposes are to encourage and assist local governments and officials in the establishment, maintenance and administration of minimum requirements for the construction and use of buildings to secure public safety to life and limb.

To promote uniformity in such regulations, BOCA provides building codes suitable for the needs of any size community—and makes them available to local governments without obligation. It provides administrators of buildings codes with services to assist in keeping codes up-to-date; in recognizing the performance of new materials and construction techniques; and in solving difficult administrative problems. It assists industry in the standardization of products and regulations—and in presenting the behavior of building products to local officials.

Since 1915 the Building Officials Conference of America has been dedicated to the professionalization of the building official and improvement in the administration of building regulations. With the publication of the first edition of the Basic Building Code in 1950, however, the major interest of the organization appears to have been securing code adoptions. This heavy emphasis on code adoption has resulted in BOCA being commonly known in some circles as a "Model Code Group." As important as code adoptions are to the organization and to the construction industry, let it be affirmed at this time that BOCA is still dedicated to the professionalization of the building official and the improvement of the administration of building regulations. Publication of model codes that can be easily adopted by local governments without cost or obligation is an important part of BOCA activity: It should be kept in perspective, however, and plainly labeled "A service to the people furnished by the Building Officials Conference of America."

BOCA membership and services are available to local governments throughout America's without regard to the code they use. Membership is particularly beneficial to jurisdictions using independent codes because it keeps them informed of the latest developments in code activities.

## PLANNING AND ZONING

The Planning Commission is made up of five members appointed by the Board of Commissioners for a term of three years. They are: Harry A. Falls, Chairman, Edward Stein, Michael Karas, Alexander L. McNaugher, Esq., Walter Padolny, Jr. Mary Peppel serves as Secretary. The Planning Commission meets the first Tuesday of the month at 7:30 P.M. Activities for 1967 included the following: preliminary sub-divisions, 14; re-zoning changes, 12; simple sub-division requests, 7; information requests, 3. There were three special meetings last year and 11 first Tuesday meetings and 9 third Tuesday meetings.

The Zoning Board of Adjustment meets the fourth Friday of the month at 8:00 P.M. and consists of three members appointed by the Board of Commissioners for a term of three years. The Board is an adjudicating body and hears appeals involving the refusal of the Building Inspector to grant permits for the construction of buildings which are not in compliance with the Zoning Ordinance. In this capacity, the Board of Adjustment is authorized to grant variances to the Zoning Ordinance when, because of conditions, a literal enforcement of the Ordinance would result in unnecessary hardship. Members of the Board are: Wm. M. Appleton, David E. Cooper, and Edmund F. O'Neill. Robert M. Mamula, Building Inspector, served as Secretary to the Board. Of the fifty-two appeals heard in 1967, 35 were granted, 11 denied, 4 deferred, and 2 were withdrawn. Beside the 12 regular meetings held the fourth Friday of the month there were 3 supplemental meetings.
